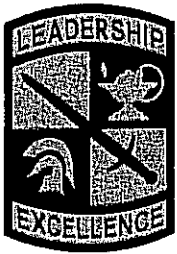
ARMY ROTC NURSING REQUIREMENTS

- ✓ Be accepted into KU or our Affiliated School
- ✓ Enroll in one Army ROTC class / semester
- ✓ Attend Army ROTC Leadership Lab 2hrs / week
- ✓ Pass Army Physical Fitness Test
- ✓ Pass Army Medical and Background Check
- ✓ Contract with Army ROTC
- ✓ Attend Leadership Development and Assessment Course (LDAC) and earn LDAC credit
- ✓ Complete Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) Degree
- ✓ Pass NCLEX
- ✓ Commission as a 2nd Lieutenant upon completion of BSN and the Army ROTC program

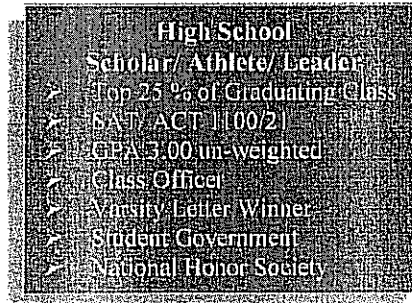


COMMISSIONING

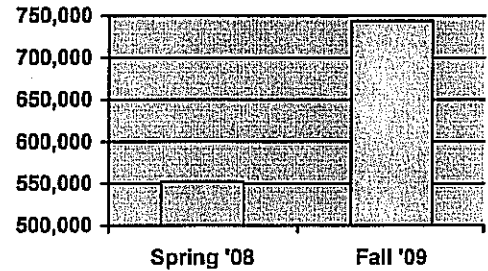
In 2008 KU commissioned 12 lieutenants. Based on current enrollment, our ROTC program will exceed commissioning goals for the foreseeable future. A wide variety of 4-, 3-, and 2-year scholarships are offered from both Army ROTC and the National Guard. To learn more about these scholarships, look at the second page.

Army ROTC Assists you to:

- Develop your skills to be an effective leader
- Maintain a high physical fitness level
- Manage:
 1. Time
 2. People
 3. Resources

Understand the team concept

- Develop a sense of:
 1. Dedication
 2. Duty

You must meet these requirements in order to join / contract:

- Minimum ACT of 19 required
- Maintain a full time student enrollment (12 hrs.)
- Maintain a semester cumulative 2.0 GPA
- Pass a physical fitness test (standards are set by age) 17-21 years is:
 1. Push-Ups: Male-42, Female-19
 2. Sit-Ups: Male-53, Female-53
 3. 2-Mile Run: Male-15:54, Female-18:54
- Be commissioned as an Army 2nd Lieutenant by the age of 31.

University of Saint Mary Army ROTC offers:

- 16 military career opportunities
- Within each career opportunity you will enhance your leadership style, and learn to develop critical staff and management skills for the corporate world
- Civilian career preparation and leadership skills
- Make the most of your education and strive to go further than your peers

After graduation:

You will be commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant in the United States Army. Next, you will go to BOLC II & Officer Basic Course, where you will study basic Army knowledge and how an Army unit functions. You will go to your first assignment, which can be anywhere in the continental U.S., Alaska, Hawaii, Germany, or Korea. Your first assignment is determined by evaluating your college performance & ROTC standing, and your preferences.

Service Obligation:

- **Scholarship recipients:**
Your total service obligation will be eight years (the first four years are full time active duty service). At completion of the first four years, you may elect to continue on active duty or enter the Inactive Ready Reserves (IRR), Army Reserve; or the National Guard, which is part-time service, for the remaining four years. The IRR is where your name is kept in a database for national emergencies.

Non-scholarship recipients:

- Your total service obligation will be eight years, the active duty, full-time service, commitment is only three years. You may elect to continue on active duty or enter the Army Reserves or National Guard, part time service, for the remaining five years.

Maintaining Minimum Academic Standard for the ROTC Program



Student requirements for Army ROTC Scholarships:

- Minimum ACT of 19 required
- Maintain a full-time student enrollment (enrolled in a Military Science course per every semester)
 1. At least 12 hours undergraduate
 2. At least 9 hours graduate
- Maintain a semester cumulative GPA of 2.5 for scholarship
- Graduate prior or at the age of 31
- Pass a medical examination
- Pass a physical fitness test
- Become an Army 2nd Lieutenant upon graduation. Your choice of:
 1. Active Army
 2. Army Reserve
 3. National Guard

The scholarship pays:

- Tuition and fees = 100% / Year
- Book allowance = \$1200 / Year
- Monthly stipend (once contracted):
 1. Freshman.....\$300
 2. Sophomore.....\$350
 3. Junior.....\$450
 4. Senior.....\$500

Undergraduate & graduate school scholarships:

- 4-year federal
- 3-year federal
- 2-year federal
- All federal scholarships are a full-time job, 4 years worldwide after graduation
- 2-year Reserve
 - Part time job, 4 years in continental United States after graduation
- 4 to 1-year National Guard
 - Part time job, 4 years in the Kansas National Guard after graduation

Application procedures:

1. Visit Army ROTC Department, receive a briefing on the program.
2. Enroll in Military Science 101, 201, or 301.
3. Become medically qualified.
4. Pass the Army Physical Fitness Test.
5. Qualify & be accepted into the Army ROTC Program.

- Yearly Stipend (1-weekend/month and 2-weeks per year)
 - 2LT with 1 year experience.....\$5,226.23
 - 2LT with 3 years experience.....\$6,574.65
 - 1LT with 3 years experience.....\$7,897.10
 - CPT with 6 years experience.....\$9,739.98
