Sister-Brother Duo Present Concert at University of Saint Mary

(Leavenworth, Kan.)— The sister and brother combination of Susan and William Goldenberg have dedicated their lives to music. Writing, teaching and collaborating music are some of their many talents, but performing is near and dear to their hearts. The Goldenberg duo will once again grace the stage to the collective “ooos” and “ahhhs” as they perform at the University of Saint Mary Walnut Room at 1:45 p.m., Thursday, Feb. 24. The special performance, made possible by the University of Saint Mary Fine Arts—Music Department, is free and open to the public. The Goldenbergs will perform a wide array of music including works composed by Bela Bartok, Bedrich Smetana and Edvard Grieg.

For Dr. William Krusemark, professor of music, the Goldenbergs live to play together. “Susan and William Goldenberg have played more than a thousand recitals together. They have literally spent their lifetimes playing chamber music together; they exemplify the idea of musical ‘ensemble,’” Krusemark said.

Susan Goldenberg has been a first violinist with the Kansas City Symphony for 23 years. Her chamber music performances include appearances at the Tanglewood Festival, the Blossom Music Festival and Yale University.

William Goldenberg is Chair of Keyboard Studies and Director and Founder of the Collaborative Piano Program at the University of Northern Illinois. His depth and artistry as a chamber musician is evident in numerous collaborations with international musicians, including members from the Berlin, London and Boston Symphonies.
