Lecture to Address the Impact of Global Poverty**

(Leavenworth, Kan.)— The University of Saint Mary Lawrence D. Starr Global Studies Institute presents Dr. Gerhard Glomm speaking about “Global Poverty: On Being Our Brother’s and Sister’s Keeper” at a lecture at 7 p.m. Wednesday, Dec. 5 in the Saint Mary Hall Social Room. This event is free and open to the public.

Glomm is a professor and chair in the Indiana University Department of Economics. Glomm grew up in Germany, but is no stranger to Kansas. He was a high school exchange student in Wichita and earned his undergraduate degree from the University of Kansas.

His lecture is part of a series of lectures increasing our awareness of global cooperation sponsored by the Lawrence D. Starr Global Studies Institute.

Some of the questions Glomm addresses are: Should the industrialized world take greater responsibility for the development of the Third World? And what are the consequences of continued neglect of growing global poverty?
